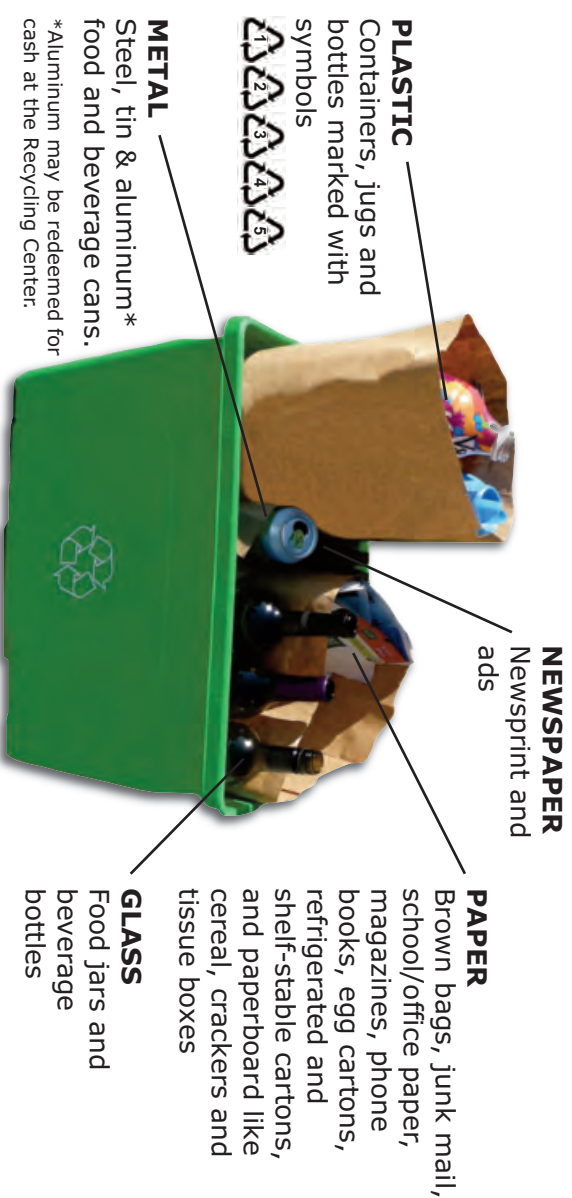
## Recycling Right By Sorting

In Kandiyohi County, we are protecting our natural environment and resources for future generations by recycling.

Located in Willmar, the Kandiyohi County Recycling Center (KCRC) processes over 7,480,600 pounds of material per year. Sorted recyclables may be dropped off 24 hours, 7 days per week at over 20 recycling drop-off sites in the County. Your cooperation to sort at time of discarding keeps our taxes low, ensures more value for recyclables and uses current equipment and buildings.

### Curb Recycling

Residents living in Atwater and Willmar receive curbside recycling at no charge.



Cardboard is not collected curbside. It should be recycled at the Recycling Center.



# 1 REDUCE

**REDUCE** Rethinking your shopping habits will save you the most money and have the greatest positive effect on the environment:
